Welcome to your new team (cont.)

NPTs are now dedicated to a single line and split up according to the London Underground General Station Manager structure – each GSM will have a single NPT to work with.

Inspector Mick McGinty (right) is in charge of the Bakerloo line. He said: “This system makes it much easier for staff and passengers who work and travel across the line as they will deal with the same NPT as they travel from station to station.



“I encourage everyone to come up and chat to our officers, they should see them more often and there are numerous planned meetings which they can attend too (see opposite).”

As well as new NPTs, staff and passengers should also see much more of officers on trains with the new Proactive Patrol Teams starting in April. These teams are specialist on-board officers dedicated to stopping offending and building links with passengers, drivers and platform staff.

NPT catches drink driver

A man was disqualified from driving recently after officers from the Bakerloo Line North Neighbourhood Policing Team caught him driving while under the influence of alcohol.

Raymond McGivern pleaded guilty at Brent Magistrates’ Court after PC Terry Hall and PCSO Tracey Redman stopped him as he was taking a shortcut along a railway road near Stonebridge Park station on 10 December.

Terry said: “McGivern had been at an event at Wembley Arena and used the shortcut to avoid the A406.

“It must have been quite a surprise for him when we pulled him over.”

McGivern was disqualified from driving for 20 months, fined £750, £200 costs and a £15 victim surcharge.

Helping to reduce suicides

The Bakerloo Line North NPT have been addressing suicide hotspots at Harrow & Wealdstone Underground station

PC Terry Hall and PCSO Tracey Redman have worked with staff, Network Rail, local support groups and mental health units in Harrow and Wealdstone to address the suicide issues at the station.

The officers have met and attended training with The Samaritans regarding spotting the signs of suicide.

Throughout the station there are posters displayed along with a free phone telephone number to offer support to anyone should they require it.

Network Rail has also looked at ways of reducing suicides at this location by conducting surveys and measurements for safety railing to be built and put in place.

Officers regularly patrol Harrow & Wealdstone providing a high visibility presence to both staff and members of the public ensuring safety is paramount.

Bakerloo Line South NPT takes on beggars

PC Azeen Latif, PC Alex Henderson and PC Jane Vine of the Bakerloo Line South NPT have been operating a zero tolerance on beggars on all the stations on their group which include stations such as Elephant and Castle, Charing Cross and Lambeth North.

This is in order to try and reduce the associated anti-social behaviour that can often lead to more serious public order offences.

PC Latif said: "The main reason in dealing with these beggars is to stop them getting used to using these busy stations to beg for money which is used sometimes to purchase drugs.

"Also more often then not they have a somewhere to live and are not actually homeless."
